Curriculum

The Master of Arts in Counseling Psychology requires 48 semester hours of graduate study focused in two major areas: counseling core and a specialty area. The program includes 450 clock hours of practicum/ internship experience for six semester hours of course credit. Students must also take and pass a comprehensive examination during their final semester of study.

CPSY 499 Independent Research should be taken at that time and the student should register for his or her faculty mentor's section of CPSY 499 Independent Research. Voluntary (i.e., not for course credit) participation in research for more than one semester is recommended.
- ² Practicum/Internship requires 450 hours of supervised experience in a setting relevant to community counseling practice.
- ³ General Elective can be another course selected from Research Elective list, or 3 semester hours from this list.
